## 5. PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

### Key achievements and contribution through planning-law practice

- 2014 **For the Strategic Planning Team in Tel Aviv-Yaffo's Municipality in the field of housing.**
- Compiling reports and legal opinions for the municipal planning team with respect to housing, appeal tribunals, and secured tenancies. The project also sought new regulatory measures to enforce viable living standards in rented apartments in Tel Aviv and Jaffa.
- 2012-2013 **For City of Bat Yam ensure long-term maintenance for high-rises.**
- Working with the Strategic Team of Bat Yam Municipality in the planning department in order to devise new regulatory instruments (in the form of bylaws) aimed at ensuring long-term maintenance of high-rise residential blocks built during Pinuy-Binuy projects (urban renewal).

- Litigating hundreds of land use cases before appeal tribunals, the District and Administrative Court and the Supreme Court.**
- On behalf of the City of Tel Aviv-Jaffa: Litigated approximately 30 cases in administrative and district courts; at least 500 cases before appeal tribunals, and represented the City in at least 15 court cases before the Israeli Supreme Court. For example:

- Won a significant case for the city in which the court adopted my interpretation of a local zoning ordinance pertaining to underground building rights (FAR) in the entire city (See Administrative Appeal 9385/05 (in the **Supreme Court**) Weinberg vs District Appeal Tribunal of Tel Aviv).
- Won a significant case which enabled the City to implement an important regeneration plan in a derelict brownfield. The court ruled that the designation of a privately owned public space (POPS) by the City, does not amount to expropriation (an act of Taking). (See Administrative Appeal (in the **Supreme Court**) 9080/04 Haboreg Inc. vs the District Planning Commission).
- Won an appeal lodged against the City's Planning Commission, in which the petitioner's plea was denied: The Supreme Court ruled that a civil appeal cannot overtake criminal proceedings (See Administrative Appeal (in the **Supreme Court**) 1630/08 Nuriel vs the District Appeal Commission of Tel Aviv).
- Won an appeal directed against the City and Israel Land Administration which sought to annul a local outline plan. Contrary to petitioner's request, the court ruled that the new land use included in the town planning scheme (Housing) is not void. This case paved the road for the future development of a new neighborhood (See High Court Petition No. 5957/03 (in the **Supreme Court**) Hevra Kadisha vs The National Planning Commission and the Local Planning Commission of Tel Aviv).
- Litigated one of the most contentious cases involving Historic Preservation in Israel. The case involved refurbishment of Tel Aviv's concert hall, a designated landmark. Local groups opposed the renovations plan but eventually it was approved by the district appeal tribunal (See Appeal No. 5462/06 (in the **District Appeals Tribunal**) Friends of Mann Auditorium vs the Local Planning Commission of Tel Aviv).
- Litigated important conservation-related disputes such as Appeal No. 5332/06 Partner Telecom Inc. vs the Local Planning Commission of Tel Aviv (in the **District Appeals Tribunal**). The appeal tribunal adopted my view that Telecom antennas should not be placed on top of historically designated landmarks.
- Litigated 'mundane' land use cases such as Administrative Appeal 1505/07 (before the **Administrative Court**) Michaeli vs the District Appeals Tribunal, in which the court adopted the City's view that a permit (a variance) should be issued to the applicant, despite neighbors' objections.
- Served as expert witness, on behalf of the City, in District Court Appeal No. 1374/06 Heshin Adiel vs Israel Land Administration (before the **District Court**). My expert opinion assisted the petitioners to get back their land which was expropriated by the government.

- Handled important and sensitive cases that have had notable city-budget implications. For instance, in 33526/03 David Cohen vs the City of Tel Aviv (before the **Magistrate Court**) I managed to repel a lawsuit which, if won, could have had detrimental impact on city budget. The court ruled that the City did not have to pay back moneys it had received, even though the services for which the money had been paid were not strictly delivered.

**Preventing environmental degradation: Fighting underground contamination of drinking water:**

- Together with the deputy mayor, helped impose a new condition in Planning Permits, according to which any development associated with Gas Stations needs to undergo strict environmental review. See: <http://www.ynet.co.il/articles/0,7340,L-3058517,00.html>

**Devising new regulatory instruments:**

- Drafted several enactments. For example, a new bylaw which allows the city to impose aesthetic control measures on landowners. The bylaw enables the city to demand that owners refurbish the exterior façades of their homes once every 15 years.

**Protecting Historic Monuments:**

- As an advisor to Preservation Architects and the City's preservation unit: Gave legal advice and litigated on behalf of the city in order to ensure the protection of historic districts and landmarks; Participated in municipal committees that compiled guidance for historic preservation; Wrote a report on Mann Auditorium (Tel Aviv's Concert Hall) which facilitated its adaptive re-use. The report surveyed the legal instruments available for the City to allow the refurbishment of the Auditorium as a designated landmark.

**Facilitating development: Helping the City Chief Engineer and the City Architect of Tel Aviv-Jaffa negotiate with developers**

- Managed to bridge disputes between the City Architect and developers. For example, with respect to new high-rise developments alongside the Ayalon Freeway, through assisted negotiations a deal was struck between the City staff and local developers which enabled the city to start digging an underground vehicular tunnel alongside Tel Aviv's freeway.
